Dear Parishioners and visitors, Let Your , Than Your Do not be afraid! Do we have fears? Are we afraid? We may 工 have different situations in our life where we experience the real fear. Some of us fear the places and some others fear the people. Some concerns may be about losing possessions and HEBREWS 13:6 others about positions. The words of Jesus from the Gospel of Saint Matthew gives us strength, "Fear no one." The Bible repeats the phrase "do not be afraid" 365 times. We can only be free from fears if we have a sense of strong security. That is a call truly to believe in the Lord and live for everlasting life, trusting in God. The first reading presents that prophet Jeremiah had lots of people trying to make his life difficult and to kill him. Even his friends had been working against him. Of course, sometimes his enemies made his life difficult. Yet he knows that God is with him. To have God with us is not a magic and we can still encounter very difficult situations. But if our trust is in the Lord, we know that in the McGrath, Lorraine Kumar, John Spillane end, all shall be well. That end may be today, tomorrow or even after our death! But the challenge is simply to cling to the Lord. In today's world, the Christians are more and more likely to encounter problems, when they really rally behind the true Gospel values. The values of Jesus are being rejected by many in our world and called into question. People can be misunderstood even when they speak about love and compassion and may become victims of "hate speech." We should not want to abandon our faith in order to avoid being rejected and judged by others. Most of us want a simple and quiet life to live in peace. When Jesus say: "Fear no one," It doesn't mean that we need not fear anyone or we can do anything we want, in a way we wish. It does mean that we shouldn't run away from the realities feeling afraid of the change. It means that we must trust in the plan of God and proclaim the word of God and live it without fear. The word of the Lord gives us strength and Hope. The word of the Lord and life in Christ is the centre of the life of a true Christian. The temptation to rest on the external securities is a sign of a weakened relationship with the true centre. Heaven is not a lotto, it is a reward for a life in Christ, with fear of God. Fear of God does not mean that we should be afraid of God. It means that we should respect God, worship God, and be more concerned with fulfilling the 'Law of love' of God. Let us be ready to walk with the Lord, rejoicing that we are found worthy to live in the presence of the Lord. Lord's Blessing, Fr Regi

Prof. Timothy P. O'Malley is academic director of the Notre Dame Centre for Liturgy and director of education at the McGrath Institute for Church Life. He teaches and researches at the University of Notre Dame in liturgical-sacramental theology and is the author of ten books including works on liturgical formation and

the doctrine of real presence. Prof O'Malley speaks at conferences and events throughout the USA and Europe and is a consultant to various committees of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops.



Rev. Dr. Tom Elich earned a Doctorate of Theology in Paris, specialising in medieval liturgy and sacraments. Since then, he has been director of Liturgy Brisbane. For a decade, he was national secretary for liturgy with the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. In the 1990s, he took part in the work of ICEL, and then

taught liturgy at the Brisbane College of Theology and at ACU. He is a long-time member of the international Societas Liturgica, the Australian Academy of Liturgy, and the National Liturgical Architecture and Art Council. He recently finished almost fifteen years as parish priest at Bulimba in Brisbane.
