

Dear Parishioners and visitors,

As we celebrate Father's Day this Sunday, let us give thanks to God for all the dad's in our parish. The grandfathers, the uncles, the brothers and cousins, in fact, all those men who provide the love of a father to us.



A father is the man who is just and gentle. A person who we feel makes us stronger in ourselves.

Success and failures, another two realities in life. Everyone in their life enjoy the sweetness of their glorious days but also taste the bitterness of the dark moments. Peter was placed in charge of the Church by Christ. Everything seemed to be wonderful.

Jesus now predicts about the passion and death; he is to face for the salvation of humanity. Even though, at the end of the day, there was the glory of the resurrection, the disciples got stuck in the suffering part of Christ's life. They were not happy with what they never expected. Peter, as usual, was the first to respond, "this must not happen to you". "Get behind me Satan", was the reply he received from Jesus.

This Gospel passage comes immediately after last Sunday's Gospel when Jesus called Peter, "Blessed", for proclaiming that Jesus was the Christ. He told him that he was the rock upon which Jesus would build His Church. He told Peter, that Peter's decisions on earth, would have power in heaven.

How did Peter fall so quickly? He fell because he was reasoning things out the way people of the 'world' would reason. He was not thinking the way God thinks. He lacked real wisdom. The way of the 'world' would be, "Save your life. Don't let anyone kill you." The way of the Lord would be, "Make the sacrificial love of God real. Sacrifice yourself for others."

It is easy for us to think the way the 'world' thinks. Everything around us may tell us to take not give, to be concerned about ourselves first and others second, or third or fourth. Fit God in somewhere, if you care and that is the thought process of the 'world'.

We were joined to a 'new world' when we were baptized. Each of us is a key part of the new world, the Kingdom of God. There may be hundreds of people in each of our lives, who look to us to illuminate their darkness with the Light of Christ. The problem is that we can easily be enticed by all that is around us and easily reject all that is within us. And so, we often straddle major issues in life.

Even though we recognize our dignity as sons and daughters of God, we often let ourselves get involved in actions that are far less than holy. We think that we are OK, because we are firmly planted on the Lord's dock, but Jesus invites us to join him to carry the cross, so that all of us shall have the eternal joy and peace. let us choose God, denying the self.

Congratulations to the candidates who were sealed with the fruits and gifts of the Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation last Thursday. Thanks to the sacramental program team for their


